

Greim, Helmut, M.D.

Prof. Dr. med. Helmut Greim was chairman of toxicology and director of the Institute of Toxicology and Environmental Hygiene at the Technical University in Munich from 1987 to 2003. He was head of the Institute of Toxicology, GSF-Forschungszentrum für Umwelt und Gesundheit in Neuherberg, Germany, from 1975 to 2000. After receiving M.D. degrees from medical schools in Freiburg and Berlin, Prof. Greim was associate professor of pharmacology and toxicology in the Department of Toxicology at the University of Tübingen and research associate professor of pathology at the Mount Sinai School of Medicine, New York, from 1970 to 1973. He has served on a number of committees, including the German Society of Pharmacology and Toxicology and the Board of Experts on the Environment for the German Federal Ministry of the Environment. He served as chairman of the Commission for the Investigation of Health Hazards of Chemical Compounds in the Work Area (MAK, 1992 - 2007), was chairman of the German Advisory Committee on Existing Chemicals (BUA, 1998 - 2007) of the Gesellschaft Deutscher Chemiker (GDCh), and was a member of the Enquête-Commission Environment and Health of the German Parliament (1992 – 1994). In 1998 he received the Arnold J. Lehman Award of the Society of Toxicology. He serves as chairman of the EU Scientific Committee on Health and Environmental Risks (SCHER) and is a member of the EU Scientific Committee on Occupational Exposure Limits (SCOEL) and of the Risk Assessment Committee of the European Chemicals Agency (ECHA). Prof. Greim has published over 300 papers in scientific journals.
